Ben Raines is an environmental journalist and filmmaker. A longtime newspaper reporter, Raines has won more than two dozen awards for his coverage of environmental issues and natural wonders in Alabama and on the Gulf Coast, and coauthored several peer-reviewed papers published in scientific journals. He wrote and directed The Underwater Forest, an award-winning film about the exploration of a 70,000-year-old cypress forest found off the Alabama coast. Raines also wrote and produced the documentary America's Amazon, which has aired on PBS stations around the country and been distributed to public schools across Alabama. His underwater film work has appeared in documentaries on the Discovery Channel and National Geographic TV. Raines co-authored the book Heart of a Patriot with U.S. Sen. Max Cleland, which chronicled Cleland's journey from triple amputee to the Senate. Ben is a graduate of New York University's Tisch School of the Arts with a degree in filmmaking, and is a U.S. Coast Guard-licensed captain, giving tours of the Mobile-Tensaw Delta and Alabama's barrier islands. He lives with his wife and son in Fairhope, Ala.

9:45 Todd Crandall ALL THINGS TEA: The Plant, the processing and the pleasure

Todd Crandall, MBG Director of Grounds and Facilities, will introduce us to Camelia sinensis, the tea plant. Todd will present how to harvest young tea leaves and process them to make our own green tea. Prior to joining the MBG staff, Todd was responsible for converting a thirty-acre working timberland into a thriving tea plantation in Walterboro, S.C. Young plants were established from cuttings and within four years the first crop was harvested. The primary product was a brewed tea concentrate widely used in restaurants. There may even be the opportunity for attendees to harvest their own leaves from our Tea Maze! Everyone will receive instructions in drying the fresh leaves for brewing green tea.

11:30 Aeriell Cashin Herbal Mixology: How to make herb-forward libations

Aeriell Cashin, MBG Event Coordinator and Operations Manager, will be showing us how to make herbs the star of crafted cocktails (and mocktails!). With an interactive presentation and live demonstration, we will learn that the world of herb-infused beverages goes far beyond the mint in a mojito.

For many years, prior to joining the MBG staff, Aeriell was a bartender with a passion for concocting botanical infused craft cocktails. Following the presentation, attendees are welcome to enjoy one of these herb-forward cocktails or mocktails in what may be the perfect setting.. a botanical garden!
